Departmental Activities

Highlights

My recent Alumni News comments have focused on what was happening here, in particular on new faculty. A very successful Planning Advisory Council event and recent awards to alumni remind all of us that we are a much larger community than just the current faculty and students.

- ③ Last November five alums -- Joe Abel (BSCP 1959), Vern George (BSCP 1961), Dean Macris (MSCP 1958), Joy Mee (MUP 1970), and Bob Teska (MSCP 1961) -- joined with students and faculty on teams to address community development issues in a neighborhood in north Champaign. Each team was led by an alum and in each case student and faculty team members saw planning leadership in action. Although teams followed different patterns in developing their analyses and proposals, the experience of working with a seasoned practitioner was enlightening and energizing. Students recognized the tradition into which they will be graduating, and alums were impressed with the quality of students and the skills they are learning and facilities they have with which to work. We will repeat the experience in some similar form next year.
- ④ This spring, the Student Planning Organization has set up a series of sessions by alums to describe the current job situation in planning and to discuss the job search process. This not only confirms the strong continuing professional orientation of our students, but the initiative they have taken in developing programs to achieve their objectives.
- ① This year's American Planning Association national awards highlight two of our alums. Dean Macris, former director of planning for the City of San Francisco will receive the Distinguished Leadership by a Professional Planner Award for his work in Chicago in the 1960s and in San Francisco in the 1970s and 80s. Dean also gave the Karl Baptiste Lohmann lecture here on campus last fall, recounting his path from Mumford Hall to leadership in San Francisco. Champaign's Neighborhood Wellness Action Plan won the award for Planning Implementation for a Small Jurisdiction. The program, which targets neighborhood services to 15 residential areas and enhances citizen participation, resulted in the creation of a Neighborhood Services Department. The concept of neighborhood wellness is used to set funding priorities. Ivy Lewis (MUP 1990) was the project coordinator of this program. Ivy has also been a frequent visitor to workshop courses in the department in the last couple of years.

We are confident that the students we are recruiting will continue the tradition of accomplishment that alums have established and we are committed to working with you to bring lessons from planning practice into the activities of our students.

City Planning And Landscape Architecture Library

The City Planning and Landscape Architecture Library, located in 203 Mumford Hall, has long been recognized as second only to Harvard in the breadth and depth of its collections. The 20,000 volumes housed in Mumford Hall, largely recent publications, plus a core collection of classics and references materials, are complemented by approximately 100,000 volumes of older material located in the Main Library bookstacks. The CPLA Library subscribes to over 200 journals and adds 800-900 new monographs annually. Special collections include theses, planning reports, newsletters, nursery catalogs, and newspaper clippings on local planning issues. Non-print materials (slide sets and videocassettes), selected by the librarian, are housed in the Undergraduate Library Media Center for use by faculty and students. Extensive lending through interlibrary loan networks testifies to the regional and national importance of this collection.

Placement Office

Faculty and Staff

Current Faculty



Kieran P. Donaghy, Assistant Professor of Urban and Regional Planning; PhD, Cornell University, 1987

The thread connecting Dr. Donaghy's diverse areas of research, teaching, and practice is an interest in developing dynamic models that will help communities, states, and countries to understand how complex social and natural systems are inter-related and how different courses of action may alter evolving patterns for better or worse. His applied research has been focused on state and local development, macroeconomic policy, arms race and military spending issues, and the coordination of international economic policies. One of the few continuous-time applied econometricians working in this country, he has taught courses in economic development and various aspects of formal modeling for planning and public policy analysis. Before coming to the University of Illinois, Dr. Donaghy taught at Cornell University and the University of Delaware. He has served as a consultant to the World Bank and various international, state, and local agencies. A closet social theorist, he can be heard around the department singing little known verses of obscure old songs.



Clyde W. Forrest, Professor and Associate Head, Department of Urban and Regional Planning; JD, University of Tulsa, 1962

With the University since 1967, Professor Forrest is both an attorney and planner. He has been in private practice and served as Assistant Director of the Office of Urban and Community Planning, University of Oklahoma. From 1959 to 1962 Professor Forrest was the legal coordinator for the Tulsa Metropolitan Area Planning Commission. Recognized as an expert on state and local land use and zoning and subdivision law, he has written model legislation for the State of Illinois; consulted with federal, state, and local governments; and led public service and continuing education programs in planning and environmental law. He teaches law and planning implementation, environmental law, and state and local government law. Current research includes studies of groundwater, federal environmental regulation, land-use controls in relation to the taking issue. Professor Forrest served as Director of the Illinois General Assembly's Land Resources Study Commission. He is Coordinator of the Master of Urban Planning program and the Professional Development Officer of the Illinois Chapter of the American Planning Association.



R. Varkki George, Assistant Professor of Urban and Regional Planning; PhD, Ohio State University, 1992

The belief that vital, vibrant urban places contribute significantly to quality of life in cities is central to Dr. George's work. He draws on his undergraduate education in architecture, his experience as a professional architect, and his graduate studies in planning to explore how such spaces can be designed in today's world. This exploration has taken him in two directions: one having to do with what urban design does, the other with how we design and plan. He teaches courses in urban design and in developing and communicating planning ideas and arguments, both graphically and verbally. His research projects include a hypermedia-based information system for historic preservation administration, customizing AutoCAD for planning applications, and a hypermedia-based pedagogical tool for urban design.



Leonard F. Heumann, Professor of Urban and Regional Planning and a member of the Housing Research and Development Faculty; PhD, University of Pennsylvania, 1973

Dr. Heumann is one of our country's most active applied researchers in housing policy as it affects minorities and the elderly. He has completed studies of how stable interracial neighborhoods evolve, how to develop better housing for low-income and functionally disabled elderly, and how to improve the analytical tools used by local planners to uncover and correct low-income housing problems. The scope of his research ranges from domestic to comparative international analysis. In recent trips abroad, he has studied advanced housing programs for the elderly in Great Britain, West Germany, The Netherlands, Denmark, Sweden, Israel, and Australia for their applicability in the United States. Dr. Heumann teaches courses in housing, social planning, planning practice, and planning theory and also coordinates the PhD program. He has written several papers on planning education, and the students in one of his workshops won a national APA award.



Lewis D. Hopkins, Department Head and Professor of Urban and Regional Planning, Landscape Architecture, and in the Institute for Environmental Studies; PhD, University of Pennsylvania, 1975

Two questions frame Dr. Hopkins's interests: "How can we create better plans?" and "When are plans worthwhile and why?" He is curious about issues that arise in both: avoiding locally optimal traps (in search or system evolution) that prevent better outcomes, eliciting and aggregating preferences, and deciding when to stop looking for better options. His research focuses on computer systems to aid planning for land use, environment, and infrastructure. Through funding by state agencies, the Department of Defense, and the National Science Foundation, he and collaborators have developed strategies for generating options that are significantly different, and also decision support systems for multiattribute evaluation. Research on the benefits of plans in dynamic systems, in collaboration with Professor Gerrit Knaap, is assessing the effects of infrastructure and land development plans in metropolitan Portland. Dr. Hopkins teaches planning theory and comprehensive planning workshops.



Eliza K. Husband, Assistant Professor of Urban and Regional Planning; PhD, Louisiana State University, 1990

Dr. Husband, whose PhD is in geography, pursues an interest in the workings of community and society that has led her into diverse fields: historic preservation, multi-ethnic community studies, and social theory. Before joining the faculty, she consulted in historic preservation in Tucson, Arizona. Work developed extending her dissertation will be published in 1995 by the Johns Hopkins University Press. She received a Beckman Award for the study of African-American participation in the planning process. She is now working on a grant-funded study of African-American participation in solid waste planning. She has developed a seminar on postmodernism in planning and geography, and also teaches courses and workshops in historic preservation and qualitative research methods. Her newest interests are home ownership among the minority-group poor, and the use of video documentary in planning research and practice.



Tschangho John Kim, Professor of Urban and Regional Planning; PhD, Princeton University, 1976

Dr. Kim began his education in his native South Korea in architectural engineering and completed his graduate study in planning at Princeton University. He has worked in Austria, Germany, South Korea, Indonesia, Sweden, Kenya, the People's Republic of China, and the United States. In 1979-80 he served as the project director of the National Comprehensive Transportation Study of Korea, sponsored by the World Bank. He also directed the Optimal Transport Sector Development Project in Indonesia in 1990-1991. Dr. Kim teaches courses in transportation analysis and the application of the social sciences in planning. Recent research funded by the National Science Foundation focused on models that attempt to show the impact of transportation on urban form and structure. Dr. Kim has published five books on Urban Systems Analysis, Regional Systems Analysis, Expert Systems Applications to Urban Planning, Expert Systems in Environmental Planning, and Spatial Planning in Indonesia. He served as the Director of the Office of Overseas University Collaboration and was the University of Illinois liaison officer to the Midwest Universities Consortium for International Activities, Inc.



Gerrit J. Knaap, Associate Professor of Urban and Regional Planning; PhD, University of Oregon, 1982

Following teaching experience at the University of Oregon, Oregon State University, Willamette University, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay and the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Dr. Knaap currently teaches economic development and analysis. His research focuses on the economics of urban issues. Research addressing the economics and politics of state land use planning and regulation has resulted in several articles, one of which won the Chester Rapkin Award for best article and research in *Journal of Planning Education*, and a book. Following post-doctoral work at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Dr. Knaap published papers on the spatial distribution of physicians in urban areas and on the difference in location orientation between for-profit and not-for-profit hospitals. Since his arrival at the University of Illinois in 1989, Dr. Knaap has written papers on economic development in small U.S. cities and co-edited a book on spatial development in Indonesia. More recently he has conducted research on environmental program evaluation and remedial action planning in the Great Lakes. Dr. Knaap is the director of the Planning Information Program and coordinator of the bachelors degree program.



Robert Olshansky, Assistant Professor of Urban and Regional Planning; PhD, University of California-Berkeley, 1987

Professor Olshansky's research, practice, and teaching focus on environmental and land use policy, seeking to understand how state and federal policies can be better translated into effective local actions. One of his major research goals is to develop better planning strategies to reduce the effects of earthquakes, landslides, and floods. Dr. Olshansky has studied earthquake preparedness in the Central U.S., and just published a series of manuals promoting state actions to reduce earthquake hazards. His natural hazard studies also include local hillside development policies, the use of seismic zonation in land use planning, and lessons learned from the Chicago flood of 1992. With Professor Forrest, he prepared a groundwater protection manual for local governments in Illinois. In the area of land use policy, Professor Olshansky is currently completing a comprehensive study of the local implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act.



Joyce Ann Pressley, Lecturer of Urban and Regional Planning; MA, 1980; MA, 1991; University of Pennsylvania

Ms. Pressley joined the faculty in August 1991. She teaches infrastructure planning, land use, and international development planning. After a double major in Economics and South Asia Regional Studies, she earned two masters degrees, one in South Asia Regional Studies and the other in Planning Theory, and is completing her PhD in City and Regional Planning from the University of Pennsylvania. She taught at the University of Pennsylvania and has worked for several private planning research groups and an international development planning firm. Ms. Pressley is one of the co-authors of "LESA: A National Inventory", published fall 1991 by the USDA Soil Conservation Service and Arizona State University. Her most recent research is on Land Evaluation Site Assessment Systems (LESA), examining the rate of adoption and problems of employment of this tool by farmers and county officials in Illinois.



Mary D. Ravenhall, Associate Professor of Library Administration, City Planning and Landscape Architecture Librarian; PhD, University of Illinois, 1980

Since receiving her PhD in Art History, Dr. Ravenhall has been serving as Librarian of the City Planning and Landscape Architecture Library and is now also an Associate Professor of Library Administration. She has searched the collections of the University Library to develop displays and to identify items for inclusion in the excellent rare book collection. This work has greatly enhanced the awareness and access of students and faculty to the extensive collection available for the study of the history of planning. Her recent research has investigated the history and development of the Library's planning materials collection, which will guide strategies to continue this outstanding collection. Dr. Ravenhall has been active in the Council of Planning Librarians as chair of the Editorial Advisory Board, which oversees the *CPL Bibliography series*, and as president of the council in 1986-87. Currently, she chairs an ad hoc committee to establish the Council's archive at the University of Illinois. On sabbatical leave in Copenhagen, Denmark she compiled an extensive annotated bibliography of English language material on planning in the Scandinavian countries, which was published by the Council of Planning Librarians in 1991.



Kenneth Reardon, Assistant Professor of Urban and Regional Planning; PhD, Cornell University, 1990

Professor Reardon's research, teaching and extension activities focus on the contribution city planning can make to resolving problems confronting low-income, urban communities. For the past fifteen years, he has worked with a variety of community-based planning initiatives focused on the employment, housing, public safety, health care, and social service needs of older residential neighborhoods in the New York Metropolitan Area. Prior to joining the department, Dr. Reardon was the director of the New York City Field Study Program of the New York State College of Human Ecology at Cornell University where he taught courses and conducted research on contemporary urban problems. His most recent research examines the status of African-American communities in Illinois. Dr. Reardon serves as the Program Coordinator for the Department's East St. Louis Action Research Project and teaches the introductory undergraduate planning course as well as a community development seminar and a neighborhood planning workshop.



Daniel Schneider, Assistant Professor of Urban and Regional Planning; PhD, Wisconsin-Madison, 1990

Dr. Schneider is an ecologist whose research focuses on the effects of disturbances on aquatic ecosystems. By applying knowledge of how natural perturbations affect ecosystems he seeks to predict the effects of human disturbances. His research extends from work on the zebra mussel and its effects on the Great Lakes and Mississippi River ecosystems, to the effects of changes in flood regime on riverine wetlands, to historic effects of settlement and changing land use on the ecology of the Chesapeake Bay region. Dr. Schneider has also worked on aquatic ecology and water resources issues in Costa Rica, Nicaragua, and Mexico. His teaching covers ecological applications to planning, watershed planning, and the historical ecology of human settlement. He also has an appointment in the Center for Aquatic Ecology at the Illinois Natural History Survey.

Faculty with Majority Time in Other Departments

Robert A. Herendeen, Associate Professional Scientist, Illinois Natural History Survey. Associate Professor, Department of Urban and Regional Planning; Associate Professor, Department of Ecology, Ethology, and Evolution; Adjunct Professor, National Center for Supercomputing Applications, University of Illinois; PhD, Cornell University, 1970.

Educated as a physicist, Dr. Herendeen has worked in energy analysis, resource economics, forestry, and aquatic ecology. He spent two years teaching in Trondheim, Norway, and is active in the International Society for Ecological Economics. Current projects include an environmental quality report for the State of Illinois, analyzing several hypotheses of ecosystem function, and modelling of fish populations in Lake Michigan and Illinois impoundments. Dr. Herendeen teaches a course on Ecological Numeracy: Quantitative Analysis of Environmental Issues.

Geoffrey J.D. Hewings, Professor of Geography and of Urban and Regional Planning, Director of the Regional Economics Applications Laboratory; PhD, University of Washington (Seattle), 1969.

Since January, 1989, Dr. Hewings has served as Director of the Regional Economics Applications Laboratory, a joint venture between the University of Illinois and the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago with a major focus on the development of models of urban and regional economies and their application in a variety of policy-related contexts. A recently completed combined econometric-input-output model of the Chicago economy is being used for projections of activity in the year 2000 and beyond. In other contexts, regional analysis has been undertaken in Bangladesh, Korea, Indonesia, and Australia, often in cooperation with graduate students in planning, geography, and economics.

Douglas Johnston, Associate Professor of Landscape Architecture, Affiliate in Urban and Regional Planning; PhD, University of Washington, 1986.

Dr. Johnston's research and teaching in information systems and decision analysis explores environmental criteria in planning. He is working with Professor Hopkins to develop a land use allocation methodology for Army training areas incorporating information about the supply of land resources and the functional requirements of training activities. Dr. Johnston is developing decision support systems for flood management and water control data systems. He is currently director of the Geographic Information Systems Lab. His teaching is directed first

at developing an understanding of value systems employed in land resource evaluation, second at exploring tools and methods for allocation decisions, and third toward application in using "real-world" problems.

John A. Quinn, Associate Professor of Agricultural Economics and of Urban and Regional Planning; Adjunct Associate Professor of Geography, SIU-C; MA, Southern Illinois University, 1963.

Professor Quinn is currently on field assignment to the Illinois Cooperative Extension Service's Southern Illinois Community Economic Development Project. Professor Quinn received the Community Development Society's "Distinguished Service Award" at the Society's annual meeting in St. Louis in July 1989. He received the Illinois Development Council's Distinguished Economic Developer of the Year Award at the Council's annual fall conference in Oak Brook in October 1989. Current activity includes local retail trade analysis, Business Retention and Expansion program and evaluations of local economic development programs.

PhD Program Faculty from Other Departments

Rabel J. Burdge, Professor in the Institute for Environmental Studies, of Agricultural Economics (Rural Sociology), Leisure Studies, and in Regional Planning PhD Program; and Professor in School of Australian Environmental Scenery, Griffith University, Australia; PhD, Pennsylvania State University, 1965.

A pioneer in the field of social impact assessment, Dr. Burdge has written extensively on natural resource and environmental issues, needs assessment surveys, public involvement in the resource decision process, and social and economic impacts of development on rural communities and outdoor leisure behavior. He taught at the University of Kentucky, University of Washington (Seattle), and the U.S. Air Force Academy, and was a resident professor at the Agricultural University of the Netherlands. Dr. Burdge served as President of the International Association for Impact Assessment, and as Vice-President of the Rural Sociological Society. He received the Society's Natural Resources Research Award, the Griffith University, School of Australian Environmental Sciences 1986 visiting scholar award, and the 1982 Theodore and Franklin Roosevelt Award for Excellence in Recreation, Park and Conservation Research. His most recent book is *A Community Guide to Social Impact Assessment*.

David Kovacic, Assistant Professor of Landscape Architecture and in Regional Planning PhD Program; PhD, Colorado State University, 1983.

As an ecosystem ecologist, Dr. Kovacic has focused on quantitative community ecology, specifically the ecosystem responses to natural and anthropogenic disturbances. He takes holistic approaches to the study of such habitat disturbances as insect outbreaks and fire and logging across a variety of landscapes ranging from Rocky Mountain ponderosa pine forests to South Carolina cypress swamps. His studies have focused not only on the effects of disturbance to vegetative habitats, but also on the ultimate effects of forage nutrient content on animal nutrition and carrying capacity. Currently, Dr. Kovacic is studying the importance of riparian forest habitat to stream water quality. The ultimate goal of this work is to determine the extent of forested buffer zone needed to reduce downstream nitrate, phosphorus, and sediment loading in agricultural areas of Illinois. He also developed an animation of the Yellowstone National Park fire history funded partially by the National Science Foundation.

Jon C. Liebman, Professor of Environmental Engineering and in Regional Planning PhD Program; PhD, Cornell University, 1965

Professor Liebman has specialized in the application of optimization techniques to problems of environmental and urban infrastructure. He is particularly interested in how decisions are made in the public sector and how quantitative tools can be used to aid in the decision-making process. He has worked in design of water resource systems, routing of refuse collection vehicles, and siting of public facilities such as fire stations and urban playgrounds. He has served as a consultant to urban governments in the operation of water supply reservoirs and on various refuse collection problems. His teaching focuses on applied operations research, primarily in optimization, vehicle routing, and facility location modeling.

Robert Riley, Professor of Landscape Architecture, Architecture, and in Regional Planning PhD Program; B. Arch, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, 1954.

Professor Riley came to the University in 1970 as head of the Landscape Architecture department. He is currently editor of *Landscape Journal* and was President of the Council of Educators in Landscape Architecture in 1984-1985. He was a principal investigator for the Illinois Streams Information System, and the Illinois Natural Areas Inventory, both for the Illinois Department of Conservation. Professor Riley's major professional interests lie in "the development and perception of the human landscape" and "meaning in landscape design."

Joanne Vining, Assistant Professor in the Institute for Environmental Studies, of Psychology, Landscape Architecture, and in Regional Planning PhD Program; PhD University of Arizona, 1983.

Dr. Vining's research interests focus on psychological factors which bear on public involvement in the solution of environmental planning problems. Her work addresses potential errors in interpreting public responses to environmental issues that are due to inadequate understanding of environmental perception, judgment, and decisions. Recent studies have examined decision processes, priorities, and emotional responses of environmental managers, special interest groups and the public. She has studied responses to solid waste management and resource conservation issues. She teaches courses in environmental psychology and public involvement in natural resource management. She was program chair of the Second Symposium on Social Science in Resource Management, and serves on the boards of *Environment and Behavior* and *the Society for Human Ecology*.

Sue Weidemann, Professor in Landscape Architecture, and in Regional Planning Program; PhD, University of Illinois, 1971

Dr. Weidemann's general research focus has been on the relationships between people's use, perceptions of, and behaviors in the designed and managed environment. She and her colleagues have been extensively involved in the study of low and moderate income housing with supplementary research in the United States, Australia, Canada, Korea, and Sweden. This award winning, long term program of research tries to determine what aspects of physical, social, and management characteristics of the residential settings are direct or indirect predictors of residential satisfaction. Her research has also examined neighborhood, city, and regional outdoor recreational and educational environments, housing for elderly and disabled, and rural environments. More recently she has studied the relationships between office design and work outcomes. Her methodological approaches are primarily empirical, emphasize multiple methods of data collection, and use multivariate analyses. Dr. Weidemann's work is known for yielding results pertinent for planning and design applications.

My work as executive director of the Illinois Heritage Association is full of challenges and surprises. During the summer of 1993 we spent many hours tracking effects on museums and cultural organizations resulting from the flooding along the Mississippi and Illinois river. We worked with other state, regional, and national organizations to coordinate efforts to provide information about resources for flood-damage artifacts. In the fall of 1993 I completed a publication, *History in Postcards: Champaign, Urbana, and the University of Illinois*, with co-author Willis C. Baker. The book, which took three years of research, was written in commemoration of the 100th birthday of the picture postcard and the 125th anniversary of the opening of the University of Illinois. Over one hundred

scenes of the local communities, each with a brief historical description, document many once-familiar sites that have disappeared, as well as landmarks that continue to give the twin cities and the campus their special character. Each spring I teach the historic preservation class in the historical administration program at Eastern Illinois University. I currently serve on the council of the American Association for State and Local History, and I am serving a second term on the Illinois Historic Sites Advisory Council, which reviews nominations for the National Register of Historic Places.

Rob Olshansky

It has been a good year for disaster researchers. I have continued working on earthquake issues, and published a colorful set of booklets on reducing earthquake hazards in the central U.S. I took a break from that for a couple of months to try to stay on top of information about floods of 1993. Mary Ravenhall

After thirteen good years as librarian of CPLA I have decided the time has come to retire and am planning to leave the library in May, 1994. With retirement in mind, I have spent much of my time on "housekeeping" activities to leave the collection in good shape for my successor. Space has long been a problem at 203 Mumford Hall and new books continue to be added at the rate of about 600 a year. Therefore, I have transferred over 1600 volumes of older material to the Main Library, freeing approximately 45 linear feet of shelving to accommodate new arrivals. Equipment has been upgraded: a second terminal for the on-line catalog and bibliographic database was added in 1993 and a printer to accompany the public terminals is on order. Twenty-four new chairs were obtained for the reading room and two ergonomic chairs were provided for the staff. Three guides to the library's collections were revised and updated: Reference Sources in the CPLA Library, Journals Received in the CPLA Library, and Slide Sets/Videos Relating to Landscape Architecture/Urban Planning in the Undergraduate Library Media Center.

Despite increased funding to help cover inflationary price increases it was necessary to cancel subscriptions to seven periodicals available elsewhere in the UIUC Library in order to augment funds for monographs and to place subscriptions to two major new journals: European Planning Studies and Topos: European Landscape Magazine. The University Library will soon be undertaking a fund raising drive to establish endowments for departmental libraries, a much needed supplement to our state funding.

I have continued to be active in the Council of Planning Librarians, attending conferences in Washington and Chicago. In June 1993 the CPL Archives were shipped to Urbana and are now part of the University Archives collection. A finding aid has been prepared and the materials are available for research. I am looking forward to the 1994 conference in San Francisco as the grand finale to my career as a planning librarian!

Eric C. Freund - Emeritus

Since retirement Professor Freund has been spending half of each year in England and the other half on campus. The following was written from England:

I go out on my various forays, which take me to all sorts of interesting places. I have spent some time supervising stabilization work to a block of houses that were subsiding on a clay bank. (Clay shrinks terribly in the dry weather that England has experienced for the past few years and lets buildings sink that have been build on top of it.) That was in Tumbridge Wells, Kent, where I used to live. Then I visited Hampton Court Palace — built by Cardinal Walsey and finished by Henry VIII in

the 16th Century — several times, to inspect and report upon a permanent building exhibition to demonstrate building faults in old buildings, and how to repair and renovate them successfully. Reports on those two have been published.

Next came the redevelopment of the London Docklands — a vast project spreading from London Bridge all the way east along the River Thames to the Royal Docks — a distance of 7 1/2 miles as the crow flies, or 10 1/5 miles if you follow the river. This comprises a large number of docks on both sides of the river, mostly left derelict after being bombed during World War II and after changes in transportation technology. I completed that project and reported on it.

I have also been following, with great interest, the restoration of a water mill near here that has lain derelict since 1939. There has been a mill on the site since before the Domesday Book of 1086 which recorded the size and use of all land in England. I have taken a photographic record of the restoration which has resulted in the economic re-use of the building as a public house and restaurant, with all the mill machinery repaired and restored to working order — with various aesthetic frills of course. Great to see a building change from a derelict mess to an economic entity. That will be written up in due course, as will another watermill that I have discovered. The machinery there has been completely restored and will eventually grind and sell flour. The only trouble at the moment is that the river that powers it has dried up — nature beats man's efforts sometimes!

I was invited to the unveiling of a section of the reconstructed Globe Theater (of Shakespeare fame) by Prince Edward, on the S. Bank of the Thames near Southwark Bridge. I have been doing research on it for the last 3 years while the project has been under way. No doubt this will culminate in a long technical article!

Salisbury Cathedral — which has the highest spire in the U.K. — is presently under repair, and I was invited to go up said spire to view the works in progress. I have done similar inspections at St. Paul's Cathedral, Westminster Abbey, and Wells Cathedral, some of which I have written on. I plan to go to Cornwall to do some research on the mines — maybe leading to a book.

This past year was extremely busy with the passage of the New York State Clean Air Compliance Act. I was tasked with writing the Employee Commute Options—ECO (or employer trip reduction) regulation for New York State, which is mandated by both the federal CAAA and the state statute.

We expect this ECO Program will impact approximately 6,000-7,000 employers and 3,000,000 commuters that work for affected employers in the New York metropolitan area. While the intent of this federally and state mandated provision is to improve air quality, an indirect effect may be lower traffic congestion on the highway network and a compelling motivation to change travel behavior outside of normal market forces. Time will tell how this ECO Program will influence commuting habits and regional air quality.

We sometimes comically call this ECO Program the "Full Employment Act for Planners" because of the large staffing requirement needed to administer the Program and work with affected employers. We expect New York City and five other affected counties will hire approximately 125-135 staff professionals. Interested graduates are advised to contact the New York State ECO contact representatives from the list that I've forwarded to U of I's Urban and Regional Planning's Placement Office or contact me as soon as possible.

When I'm not conducting an "ECO Road Show" with employers and local officials in the New York metro area, Judy and I continue to live on our farm in Cambridge and dream of what life was like in simpler times.
